We are a church school... Love never fails 1 Corinthians 13:8 Our Christan values to be explored this half term is Humility. We have been looking at what being humble looks like.




What is humility?

### Slapped Cheek Syndrome

We appear to have a few cases of slapped cheek syndrome in school and the locality. NHS guidance states – if your child is not unwell then you don't need to keep your child off school because, once the rash appears, they are no longer infectious. But please let the school know if you think your child has slapped cheek syndrome.

NHS Guidance suggests:

What to do if your child has slapped cheek

- 1. Rest
- 2. Drink plenty of fluids to avoid dehydration babies should continue their normal feeds.
- 3. Take paracetamol or ibuprofen for high temperature, headaches, or joint pain.
- 4. Use moisturiser on itchy skin.
- 5. Speak to a pharmacist about itchy skin they can recommend the best antihistamine for children.


## Head Teachers Award
