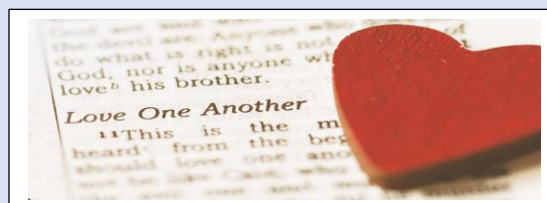
Head Teacher's Hello

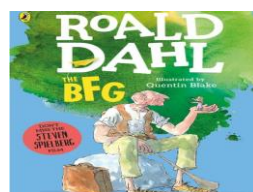

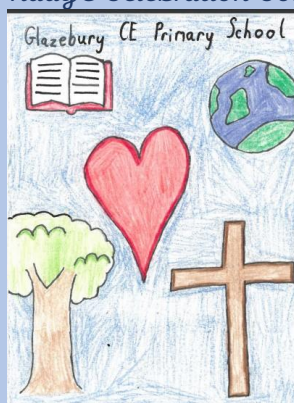

Household Support Fund

The government have committed further funds to the Household Support Fund. Those families already in receipt of the fund will continue to be paid the fund and do not need to do anything, however, if your child is eligible for free school meals you may not yet have made a claim. Families simply need to complete the form on the council's website (which also provides further information on the fund): [Household Support Fund | warrington.gov.uk](https://www.warrington.gov.uk/household-support-fund). If eligible they will receive a minimum of £90 and the release of funding is around school holidays in order to support families with meals when schools are closed.
