#### SPORTS FUNDING AND HOW IT IS ALLOCATED

At Glazebury we are committed to raising the profile of every child's physical education. We are proud to offer high quality P.E. lessons through the use of a specialised coach for every class. This ensures continuity and progression throughout both key stages. This ensures that all children receive at least two hours physical activity every week within curriculum time. **KS2 classes** go on outdoor and adventure residentials and visits. They also take part in competitions both within the school and beyond. The sports funding has allowed us to improve the quality of provision and equipment throughout the school. The impact has been positive for all pupils and has allowed more pupils to access a wide range of opportunities.

<b>Extra-Curricular Clubs</b>  Opportunities for children to attend after school physical activity clubs.	<b>£2,500</b>	Raised the profile of PE throughout the school. Pupils trained as school sports crew and change for life champions then ran lunchtime activity sessions. This gave pupils a chance to develop leadership skills and also engaged more pupils in an active lunchtime. After School clubs offer pupils another opportunity to develop skills in a variety of sports. 95% of children in school have accessed extra-curricular clubs. 12%12 children have attended 100% of all extra-curricular sessions. Children have taken part in a wider range of sports- Football, Dodgeball, Multi-Skills, Archery, Athletics, Rounders, Cricket.
Structured lunchtime multi skill clubs, engaging children during less structured time.	<b>£ 1,000</b>	Children are more active during lunch breaks taking part in 'Stay Active Lunch Clubs' Pupils trained as school sports crew ran lunchtime activity sessions, giving them the chance to develop leadership skills. 100 % of children in school have accessed structured lunchtime provision during the year.
New equipment	<b>£500</b>	Audited resources and taken steps to improve the resources in the school. A wider range of resources to allow pupils to access a wider range of sports through their PE sessions, lunchtime activities and in after school clubs.
Transport costs to attend competitions	<b>£500</b>	Used to transport pupils to external competitions throughout the year.
