

Well done Jaxx and thank you for sharing your amazing achievements.




Who will be next in our Hall of fame?

HELP PAYING FOR YOUR CHILDCARE



CHILDCARE SUPPORT CHANGING

There are significant changes to childcare support starting from April 2024 to benefit families.

- From April 2024, eligible working parents of 2-year-olds will be able to access 15 hours childcare support.
- From September 2024, 15 hours childcare support will be extended to eligible working parents of children from the age of 9 months to 3-year-olds.
- From September 2025 up to 30 hours for eligible working families in England with a child from 9 months old up to school age.

HELP PAYING FOR YOUR CHILDCARE

Find out more <u>Upcoming changes to childcare support</u> | <u>Childcare choices</u> is a great tool in order to see what funding is available to get help with childcare costs that fits your individual family needs.

- Option to buy additional top up sessions.

- Open from 7:30am to 5:15pm, flexible -mornings, afternoons, or full days.
- ♦ Term time Only 38 weeks per year.

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Golden Tickets


Nursery - Everyone in nursery for being so wonderful.


