SPORTS FUNDING AND HOW IT IS ALLOCATED

At Glazebury we are committed to raising the profile of every child's physical education. We are proud to offer high quality P.E. lessons through the use of a specialised teacher for every class. This ensures continuity and progression throughout both key stages.

We are working towards:

- Physical Education and Sport Quality Mark
- School Games Kite Mark

As a part of our P.E. provision each child receives one timetabled P.E. lesson per week.

Class 1 are physically active throughout the day in activity areas both indoor and outdoor.

Class 2 are physically active through 2 extra lunchtime sessions and in other cross curricular areas.

Class 3 and 4 take part in focused Zone Play sessions for 20 minutes every day to increase their physical activity which culminates in an intra school competition every Friday. This ensures that all children receive at least two hours physical activity every week. **Class 4** go on a 3 day outdoor and adventure residential.

The sports funding has allowed us to improve the quality of provision and equipment throughout the school. The impact has been positive for all pupils and has allowed more pupils to access a wide range of opportunities.

Allocated funds	Cost	Impact
Dedicated teacher for sport	£6000	Raised the profile of PE through ensuring a broad and balanced curriculum was maintained throughout the school. Took on a leadership role and has incorporated more opportunities for pupils through organising after school clubs, visiting coaches to support specialist teaching, organising and taking pupils to competitions, recognised areas of weakness and written an action plan to improve the quality of both teaching and learning in all areas of PE. Audited resources and taken steps to improve the resources in the school.
Extra sport and lunchtime sport for KS2	£640	Pupils trained as school sports crew and change for life champions then ran lunchtime activity sessions. This gave pupils a chance to develop leadership skills and also engaged more pupils in an active lunchtime. Extra coaching from Hoops for health, Warrington wolves and local tennis coaches allowed pupils to work with professionals to engage them in different sports. After School clubs offer pupils another opportunity to develop skills in a variety of sports. We bring in external coaches to work alongside class teachers during lessons and to run after school clubs. We have a School Sports Crew who have the responsibility of running lunchtime clubs for Class 2, supporting intra school competitions including organising an event for our school sports day. They are working alongside teachers to follow the school sports games activity pack.
New equipment	£500	A wider range of resources to allow pupils to access a wider range of sports through their PE sessions, lunchtime activities and in after school clubs.
Training for school based staff	£750	A range of training sessions have been attended to support staff in delivering high quality lessons.
Transport costs to attend competitions	£100	Used to transport pupils to external competitions throughout the year.

Sports offered in school include hockey, dance, zone play, fencing, karate, rugby, netball, rounders, gymnastics, football, cross country and cycling.
