**Commas in lists** 

Practise using commas in lists of nouns and adjectives



This sheet revises a similar one at year 2. When a sentence contains a list, commas are used between each item except at the end. For nouns, **and** or **or** link the last two words. These lists can be lists of nouns (such as *pencils, crayons and paper*) or lists of adjectives that describe a noun (such as *the large, hairy dog*).
