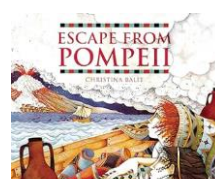

'Peep into Glazebury's History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school logbooks that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

- 1905- May 22nd – A very cold morning below 50 degrees so had to light fires in baby's room.
- 1905-June 9th -Spoke to children about trespassing in corn and meadow grass having had complaints from neighbouring farmers.
- 1905-July 27th-Drill not taken place today on account of hot and oppressive weather. The lesson will take place tomorrow instead.
- 1905-August 25th- Closed for weeks holiday

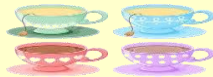
