'Peep into Glazebury's History from Log Books -We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.



February 16th 1876 -Taken the girls for sewing each afternoon this week in order for them to finish their work.

February 29th 1876 - being Shrove Tuesday gave half day holiday.

January 1877 - punished William Worral for staying away from school all morning.

June 1st 1877 - sent after absentees there being a great number away!

On Thursday at 9:15am we are inviting reception parent/carers to come into school as the children are going to show case all they have been doing since starting school in September. We envisage this to last around half an hour, hope to see you all there. We are very proud of our reception children.



As the nice weather has started and we are all hoping will continue, please can we remind you about sun safety. Please send children to school with hats (preferably) with a peak/brim to cover their face. Our uniform supplier does sell Glazebury baseball hats, or any hats will suffice that you already have. Apply an 'all day' sun cream to your child before they attend school in the morning, we will keep water bottles topped up and encourage children to drink plenty. Staff cannot apply suncream to children, the exception to this is for our nursery children that attend nursery for a full day. We ask that they still have cream applied before they arrive and then staff can top up later in the day, although you will need to have a form completed to accompany the sun cream you provide. Please discuss with nursery staff or office.



Whole school attendance so far, this academic year is 95%. Glazebury School attendance target is 97% Attendance for Week Commencing Monday 13th May 2024.



Did you know?
