'Peep into Glazebury' s History from Log Books -We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8<sup>th</sup> 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.



February 16<sup>th</sup> 1876 -Taken the girls for sewing each afternoon this week in order for them to finish their work.

February 29<sup>th</sup> 1876 - being Shrove Tuesday gave half day holiday.

January 1877 - punished William Worrall for staying away from school all morning.

June 1<sup>st</sup> 1877 - sent after absentees there being a great number away!



### **Aspirations Afternoon**

As the nice weather has started and we are all hoping will continue, please can we remind you about sun safety. Please send children to school with hats (preferably) with a peak/brim to cover their face. Our uniform supplier does sell Glazebury baseball hats, or any hats will suffice that you already have. Apply an 'all day' sun cream to your child before they attend school in the morning, we will keep water bottles topped up and encourage children to drink plenty. Staff cannot apply suncream to children, the exception to this is for our nursery children that attend nursery for a full day. We ask that they still have cream applied before they arrive and then staff can top up later in the day, although you will need to have a form completed to accompany the sun cream you provide. Please discuss with nursery staff or office.

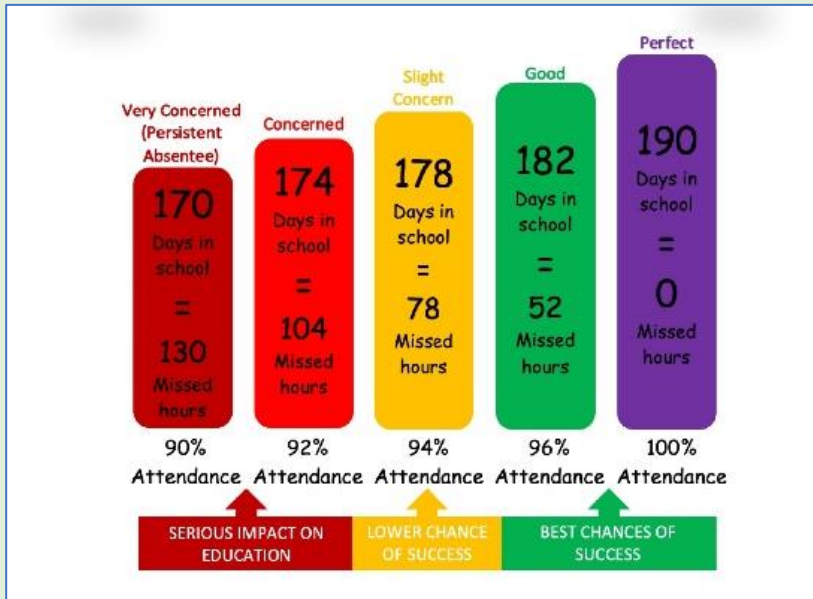
