1905-Nov 17th- was compelled to light fires in infant rooms owing to temperature being only 52 degrees.

1905-Dec 12th -scholars dismissed earlier on account of the dark foggy day.

Admissions to Reception Class 2026

Please refer to the letter sent out earlier this week, if you require any further information, please speak to Mrs. Holcroft.

If your child was born between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022, he/she is due to start reception class in September 2026.

To apply for a Reception Class place for September 2026, you will need to register your family's details using the Citizen Portal and then complete an online application form.

The on-line facility will be available from Monday 1 September 2025 until midnight on Thursday 15 January 2026.

If you do not live in Warrington, you need to apply through the local authority you pay your council tax to. Please visit your home local authority website for information.

School Coats



Well winter certainly has arrived this week. Please make sure your child always wears a school jumper/cardigan and **also always brings a coat to school**. Even if it is dry in the morning, weather can change, and it can be wet by lunchtime. **REMEMBER names in items help return when lost!**



Winter – Colds and Coughs

Return to school every September brings the usual coughs and colds.

We all have days that we are not feeling quite as well as we normally would but we are able to push through with extra drinks and sometimes paracetamol/Calpol to get us comfortably through the day. If you feel this relates to your child on a particular day and you would like them to have Calpol/paracetamol at lunchtime, this can be given by the school staff but only with your written consent. Bring the medicine to the office and complete a medicine form, the medicine will be returned to you at the end of the school day.



Term Time Appointments



Please can we ask where possible you make doctors and dentist appointments after school or during holiday periods. We appreciate this isn't always possible but your children will miss out on what is going on in school. Please note: **it is a requirement to show the appointment card/email/text as proof of the appointment.**



TRANSFER TO SECONDARY SCHOOL – SEPTEMBER 2026

Parents/carers of children who have just made the transition into Year 6 in your school will need to apply for a secondary school place for their child for September 2026 entry. The online application form will be available for parents/carers to apply from 1 September 2025 until midnight on 31 October 2025.

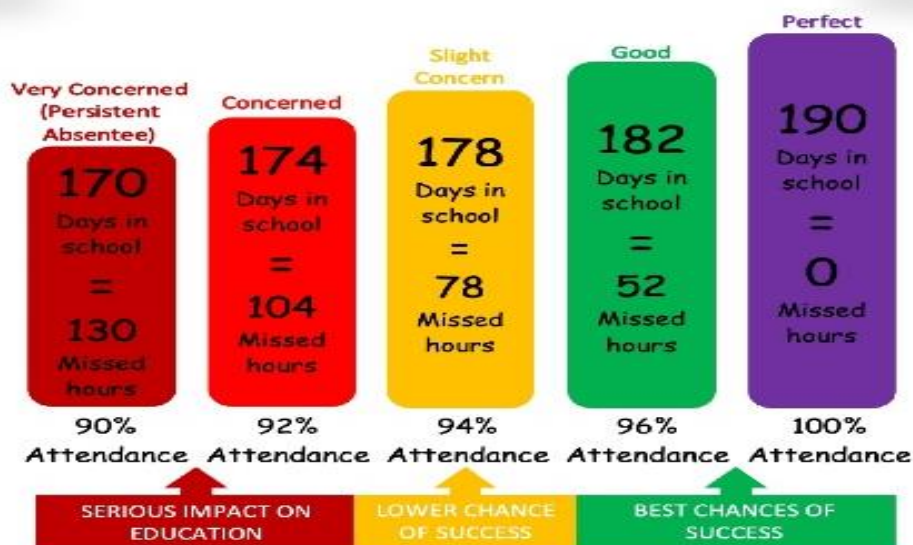
ATTENDANCE
