'Peep into Glazebury History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school logbooks that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1905- June 9th - Spoke to children about trespassing in corn and meadow grass having had complaints from a neighbouring farmer.

1905-June 29th – closed the school for holidays

1905-July 24th - reopened the school.

1905-July 29th – Drill not taken today due to hot and oppressive weather.

Admissions to Reception Class 2026

School Meals



We have been informed by Warrington Borough Council that from 1st October 2025 school meals are set to rise by 25pence from £2.80 to £3.05, resulting in an overall weekly increase of £1.25 per child. The council have advised for several years they have been subsidising the service to continue to support Warrington families during the continued economic crisis. However, this funding subsidy was not intended to be a long-term solution, and they now need to increase the price of our school meals. They remain fully committed to offering the best possible food options for our local children. The three weekly rolling menus detailing each day's main course and dessert, with the additional daily offer of a vegetarian option and/or jacket potato, will remain in place. They will therefore continue to provide a high-quality service that delivers healthy, nutritious meals, caters for all allergens and dietary requirements and is served in a safe environment on our school premises.

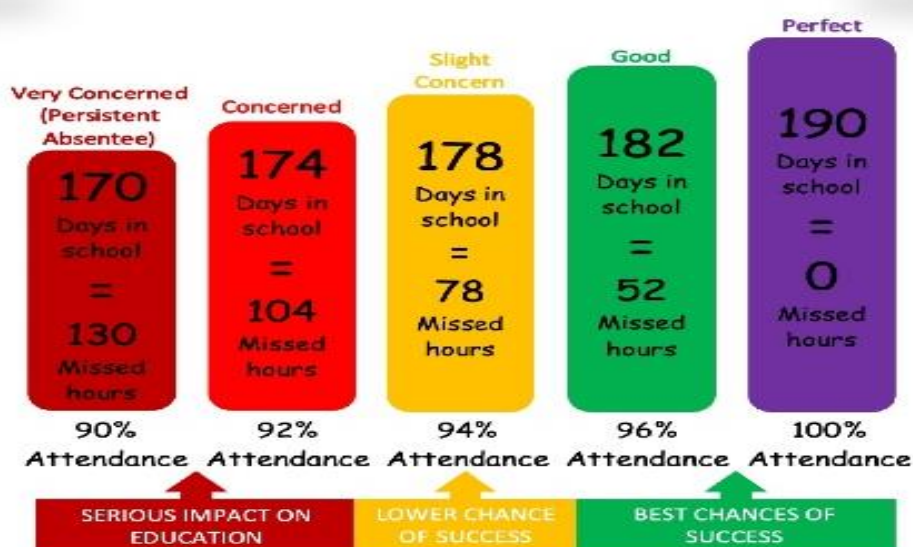


ATTENDANCE

Did you know?
