'Peep into Glazebury's History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school logbooks that date back to July 8<sup>th</sup> 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

- 1903-Nov 5<sup>th</sup>- School floor dirty this morning - not properly swept.
- 1904-May 10<sup>th</sup> -Eleven fresh cases of measles notified this morning about fifty children are now absent.
- 19.04-May 13<sup>th</sup>-Dr Challoner, medical Officer visited the school and ordered the closing of the school until Monday May 30<sup>th</sup>.
