
#### Dear all

Lilian Bader we are proud of you.



Lilian Bader was born in 1918 in Liverpool and went on to become one of the very first black women to join the British

Armed Forces. Starting out as a canteen assistant at an army base in Yorkst she eventually trained as an instrument repairer, before becoming a leading aircraftwoman and soon afterwards earning herself the rank of Corporal. When she left the army to have children of her own, she retrained and got a degree from the University of London to become a teacher. We are proud of her.

'Peep into Glazebury History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school logbooks that date back to July  $8^{\rm th}$  1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1908 April 16<sup>th</sup> – Very wet day school yard flooded on girls and infants portion, so that children had all to leave school by boy's entrance.

1908-July 1st – School closed for summer holidays until July 27<sup>th</sup>.

1908-October 15<sup>th</sup>- Warned the scholars who have to go home by train of the dangers of playing and running on the railway platform.



#### **USED COAT DONATIONS**




