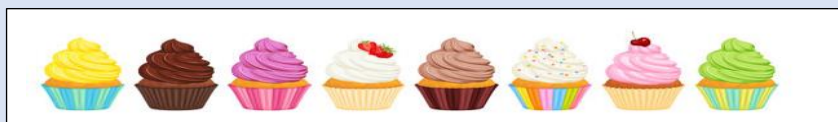
Head Teacher's Hello

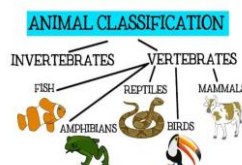

Learn, Love and Achieve with Jesus ... LDST Trust -Safeguarding

LDST schools all attended crucial Safeguarding Training this week to ensure we are up to date with current legislation, practice and refreshed in our responsibilities to the children in our care.



'Peep into Glazebury's History from Log Books - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.



1892 March 7th – The boys were examined in drawing.

1892 July 14th – The school has a holiday on account of the General Election.

1892 Oct 28th -John and Joesph Brindle cannot come to school because they have nothing to cover their feet properly.

1893 Mar 27th -The consequence of an outbreak of scarlet fever, a large number of infants are absent from school.

1893-Nov 20th The attendance is still bad, many children in Lately Common District being employed carrying fuel.

Pupil Premium / Free School Meals

There is funding available to children known as 'pupil premium' that schools can claim to support your children if they are eligible. Unfortunately, this is not automatically granted, and therefore you need to apply for it. If you feel that your family circumstances may mean you are eligible for some support, **please speak to Mrs Holcroft in the school office who will guide you through the application process.** It is always worth applying to ensure you don't miss out if you do qualify.

Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether to keep your child off school or nursery when they are unwell. 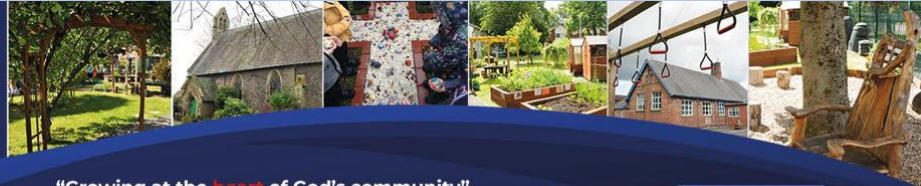
