Dear All,



'Peep into Glazebury's History from Log Books - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.



9th Jan-1883 -average of the week 173.

20th April 1883- examined the registers and found them correct-Rev Geo Feather.

21st June 1883- punished John Hindley for saying that he would throw a slate at my head.

5th July 1883- closed for midsummer holidays.

23rd July 1883-school recommenced. 27th March 1884 -Isaac Seddon is away from school on account of measles.

Sophie


