

'Peep into Glazebury's History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1900 Feb 12th- Heavy snowfall caused more than 50% of children to absent themselves. Those who came in had wet feet and were sent home immediately, school closed for the day.

1900-Feb 15th - No school in afternoon on account of the storm.

1900-Mar 2nd-New readers and 8 new desks arrived from D.W.Bardsleys, Oldham.

1900-Mar 8th-had blackboards renovated.




