'Peep into Glazebury History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school logbooks that date back to July 8<sup>th</sup> 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1907-8<sup>th</sup> March - Doris Collier away suffering from scarlet fever; this prevents her two sisters attending school.

1908-29<sup>th</sup> January - a week of bad weather, drill had to be taken in school. Friday afternoon-no play, but children were dismissed 15 minutes earlier on account of stormy weather.

1908- 10<sup>th</sup> February – two new desks arrived from Darlington- both were damaged by the railway company.
