

'Peep into Glazebury's History from Log Books - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8<sup>th</sup> 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.



Oct 14<sup>th</sup> 1887- Eliza Warhurst had been away two weeks suffering from a sore leg.

Oct 18<sup>th</sup> 1887-The school was closed today while the fire grates were repaired.

Nov 26<sup>th</sup> 1887- The attendance is still very poor. This is partly through sickness and partly through the indifference of parents having their children educated. August 1<sup>st</sup> 1887- A thunderstorm came on in the afternoon.

Jan 31<sup>st</sup>-1890- in consequence of so many children being away from school suffering from influenza a holiday was given in the afternoon.
