
Head Teacher's Hello

'Peep into Glazebury History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school logbooks that date back to July $8^{\rm th}$ 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

 $1908 - 14^{th}$ Oct – discussed with children the perils of slipping and disturbing hedgehogs as the leaves fall.

1908- 2nd Nov- Poor attendance 6 cases of Scarlett fever reported.

1908- 2nd Dec – weather poor, chilly and icy remind scholars of not walking on pond.

Admissions to Reception Class 2026

Please refer to the letter sent out earlier this week, if you require any further information, please speak to Mrs Holcroft.

If your child was born between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022, he/she is due to start reception class in September 2026.

To apply for a Reception Class place for September 2026, you will need to register your family's details using the Citizen Portal and then complete an online application form.

The on-line facility will be available from Monday 1 September 2025 until midnight on Thursday 15 January 2026.

If you do not live in Warrington, you need to apply through the local authority you pay your council tax to. Please visit your home local authority website for information.

School Uniform

We also understand that the cost of uniform can be a concern for families. To help with this, we can provide information about several organisations that support the provision of second-hand uniform. If you'd like details, please contact the school office - we're here to help.

As a reminder, here is our uniform code:

- Skirt or pinafore in Navy Blue, knee length, short skirts are not permitted.
- Trousers in Black, or shorts in Grey or Black
- Polo shirts in Light/Pale Blue (plain is fine, logo shirts are available,)
- Cardigan or jumper in Royal Blue (plain is fine, logo versions available,)
- Summer dresses in Blue Check (pale blue)
- Socks or tights in Navy Blue or White
- Shoes: any **sensible black shoes**, with a heel no higher than 1 inch
 - X No trainers or open-toe sandals




