As ever, whilst assessment are a very important part of our children's learning journey, I like to think they are also a smaller part of the whole child and assessments don't assess all the skills that children possess.

Year 6 End of Year information 2017/2018:

Test Results - A guide for parents:

This year all the children sat assessments in English Grammar, punctuation and Spelling, English Reading, and Mathematics, your child's test results show both TEST scores and SCALED scores.

What does your child need to score?

English Grammar, Punctuation, Vocabulary and Spelling Tests:

Grammar, punctuation and vocabulary test mark out of a total 50

Spelling test marked out of a total of 20

Total test score out of 70

Scaled score:

- A called score of 100 or more shows that a pupil has achieved the standard – AS
- A scaled score below 100 shows that a pupil has NOT achieved the standard – NS
- A scaled score of 110 or more shows a pupil has achieved greater depth
- Scaled scores range from 80 to 120
- A pupil needs to achieve a mark of **38** or more in the test to achieve a scaled score of 100 or more
- A pupil need to achieve a score of **56** to achieve a scaled score of 110

English Reading:

The reading test is marked out of 50.

Scaled score:

- A called score of 100 or more shows that a pupil has achieved the standard – AS
- A scaled score below 100 shows that a pupil has NOT achieved the standard – NS
- A scaled score of 110 or more shows a pupil has achieved greater depth
- Scaled scores range from 80 to 120
- A pupil needs to achieve a mark of **28** or more in the test to achieve a scaled score of 100 or more
- A pupil need to achieve a score of **40** to achieve a scaled score of 110

Mathematics:

Mathematics arithmetic test marked out of a total of 40

Mathematics reasoning test marked out of a total of 35

Mathematics reasoning test marked out of a total of 35

Scaled score:

- A called score of 100 or more shows that a pupil has achieved the standard – AS
- A scaled score below 100 shows that a pupil has NOT achieved the standard – NS
- A scaled score of 110 or more shows a pupil has achieved greater depth
- Scaled scores range from 80 to 120
- A pupil needs to achieve a mark of **61** or more in the test to achieve a scaled score of 100 or more
- A pupil need to achieve a score of **96** to achieve a scaled score of 110



Teacher Assessment Results: Teachers are asked to use their professional judgement at the end of Key Stage 2 for reading, writing, mathematics and Science. Teachers base this judgement on a wide range of evidence from across the taught curriculum for each pupil.

Writing: Teachers assess pupils accordingly –

- Working towards the expected standard –WTS
- Working at the expected standard – EXP
- Working at greater depth GDS

Teachers are also required to assess reading , mathematics and science with:

- Working at the expected standard – EXP
- Has NOT met the expected standard – HNM

There was NO requirement for teachers to state if a pupils is working at greater depth in this assessment.

Test results a guide for Parents:

Teacher Assessment Results: Teachers are asked to use their professional judgement at the end of Key Stage 1 for reading, writing, mathematics and Science. Teachers base this judgement on a wide range of evidence from across the taught curriculum for each pupil.

English Reading , Writing, Math: Teachers assess pupils accordingly –

- Working towards the expected standard –WTS
- Working at the expected standard – EXP
- Working at greater depth GDS

For science, the judgement will only report if a pupil is working at the expected standard.
