

'Peep into Glazebury's History from Log Books - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.



1891-Jan 9th -The School Attendance Officer visited the school. Joeseph Drinkall has been away several weeks suffering from Dropsy.

1891-March 2nd – A very large number of the children are absent in account of measles. Many of the parents are taking advantage of the epidemic and are allowing their children to play in the lane. Some even allow their children to visit houses in which there is disease.

1891- Sept 1st- SCHOOL FEES are abolished from this date.

APPLYING FOR A YEAR 7 PLACE FOR SEPTEMBER 2025

If your child was born between 1 September 2013 and 31 August 2014, he/she is due to transfer to secondary school in September 2025.

To apply for a Year 7 place for September 2025, you will need to register your family's details using the Citizen Portal and then complete an online application form. The online facility for secondary transfer admissions will be available until **midnight on 31 October 2024.** For details on how to register and apply online please refer to the information letter.

If you do not live in Warrington you need to apply through the Local Authority you pay your council tax to, even if your preferences are for schools in another Local Authority. Please visit your home Local Authority's website for information on how to apply.


