1905-14th March - Mrs Clegg, sewing mistress away ill, consequently no sewing has been done this week.

1905-14th April - several children are away from school with whooping cough -Marian Holden, Elsie Dean, Eliza Warhurst.

1905-22nd May - a very cold morning - as baby's room was below 50 degrees it was necessary to light a fire.
