Head Teacher's Hello




Dear all,





'Peep into Glazebury History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school logbooks that date back to July $8^{\rm th}$ 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1906-16th May-New sewing table and chest combined arrived from J Griffiths & Co. 1906-19th June – a fresh case of Scarlet Fever i.e. Sarah Murray notified this morning.

1906-September 3rd- Re-opened school with a poor attendance, several parents away this week with their children on holidays.

Admissions to Reception Class 2026

Please refer to the letter sent out earlier this week, if you require any further information, please speak to Mrs Holcroft.

If your child was born between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022, he/she is due to start reception class in September 2026.

To apply for a Reception Class place for September 2026, you will need to register your family's details using the Citizen Portal and then complete an online application form.

The on-line facility will be available from Monday 1 September 2025 until midnight on Thursday 15 January 2026.

If you do not live in Warrington, you need to apply through the local authority you pay your council tax to. Please visit your home local authority website for information.

TRANSFER TO SECONDARY SCHOOL – SEPTEMBER 2026

Parents/carers of children who have just made the transition into Year 6 in your school will need to apply for a secondary school place for their child for September 2026 entry. The online application form will be available for parents/carers to apply from 1 September 2025 until midnight on 31 October 2025.

School Meals







We have been informed by Warrington Borough Council that from 1st October 2025 school meals are set to rise by 25pence from £2.80 to £3.05, resulting in an overall weekly increase of £1.25 per

child. The council have advised for several years they been subsidising the service to continue to support Warrington families during the continued economic crisis. However, this funding subsidy was not intended to be a long-term solution, and they now need to increase the price of our school meals. They remain fully committed to offering the best possible food options for our local children. The three weekly rolling menus detailing each day's main course and dessert, with the additional daily offer of a vegetarian option and/or jacket potato, will remain in place. They will therefore continue to provide a high-quality service that delivers healthy, nutritious meals, caters for all allergens and dietary requirements and is served in a safe environment on our school premises.



Pupil Premium Funding Scheme











If any of the following are applicable to your family circumstances, then you may be entitled to claim for additional funding for your child which is called Pupil Premium and free school meals.

My/our earnings are above £16,190

I/we receive working tax credits

I/we receive Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.

I/we receive Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

I/we receive Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

I/we receive Income support (is)

I/we receive Income based job seekers allowance (ibjsa)

I/we receive Income related employment and support allowance (iresa)

I/we qualify for support under part vi of the immigration and asylum act 1999

I/we qualify for the guaranteed element of Pension Credit


