'Peep into Glazebury's History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school logbooks that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1904-Sept 26 -Arrangement of work somewhat upset by repairs to heating apparatus and hot water pipes in school room.

1904-Oct 14th-Caned several boys for throwing stones and warned them against climbing

1904-Oct 18th-warned children about the danger of fireworks and forbade them to bring any onto the school premises.

Clubs welcome pupils in Year 2 —Year 6. The cost of each club is £3.50 per week. Payment is via ParentPay.

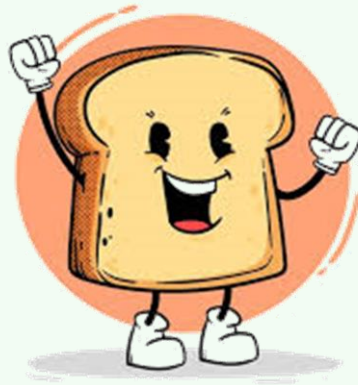
If your child is already booked into Extended Club, they will automatically attend the clubs.

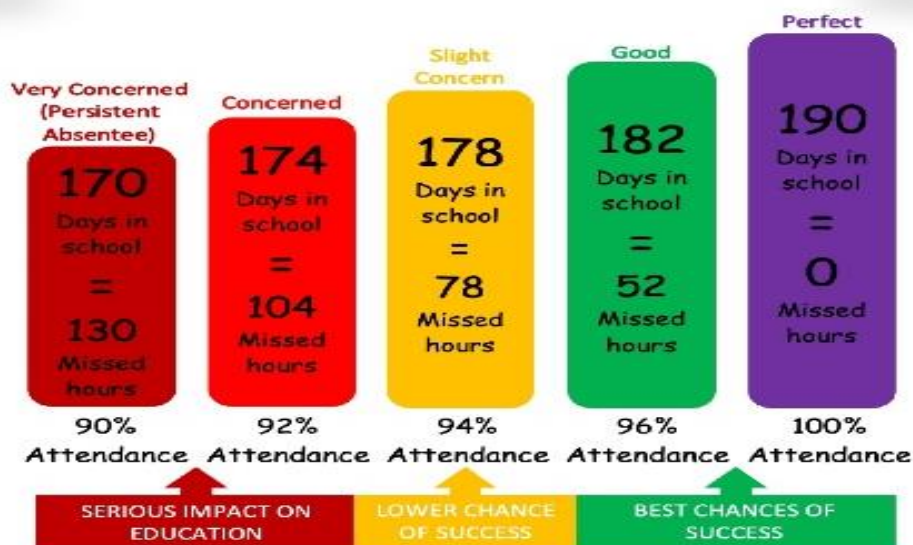


ATTENDANCE
