1906-15th May - had occasion to punish four boys for trespassing on school premises on Saturday.


1906-22nd January - Election Day. School closed early in the afternoon.

- T**ake turns communicating
- A**ttention: remove distraction such as turn off the TV put away your phone
- L**isten and respond to how your child communicates
- K**eep language simple
- S**it with your child so you can see each other's faces
- H**elp them turn the pages
- A**ttempt to their requests
- R**epeat what they communicate and copy what they do
- E**njoy a book - talk about the pictures or what your child is most interested in
- P**retend - use everyday objects like cups, spoons, brushes and role play eg going shopping
- L**ove and support - you are the best play partner!
- A**llow child led activities
- Y**our responses are important

Warrington speech, language and communication pathway

Universal support

Antenatal programmes, Children's centres, Community clinics, GPs, Homestart



At each communication contact with professionals, three key messages are shared:

Talk, Share, Play

Communication improvement and monitoring

Your child's speech language and communication can be assessed and monitored at a number of points including:

- health review as part of the healthy child programme 9-12 months
- integrated progress review between 2 and 2 and a half years old
- childcare providers will monitor your child's development



No concerns

Your child's speech and language skills are as expected and don't need further support



Support needed (targeted support)

Targeted interventions may include: Parent-child WELLCOMM sessions, targeted children centres sessions, using speech language and communication (SLC) materials shared by Speech language therapy services, and/or a referral to Chatter box sessions



Specialist support required

If you and professionals have concerns, a referral to Speech language therapy may be recommended/ referral to specialist services, eg education psychology, neurodevelopmental pathway, Early Years SEND support services
