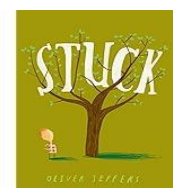

1906-Sept 10th Punished John W Wright for playing truant, this is the first case for over two years.



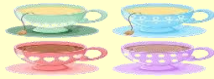


Arete

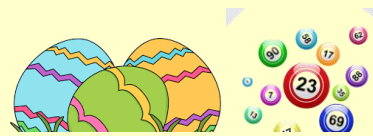

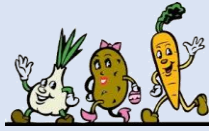
