'Peep into Glazebury's History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1895 – 13th May Since the holidays it takes 20 minutes every Monday to prepare the school for work. As usual neither ink, inkwells, chairs, table or anything else was looked after.

On enquiring from the school cleaner's daughter why chairs were not placed I was impudently told to "send no more messages by her but to see her father!"








Clubs welcome pupils in Year 3—Year 6. The cost of each club is £3.50 per week. Payment is via ParentPay.

Is my child too ill for school?


