Head Teacher's Hello



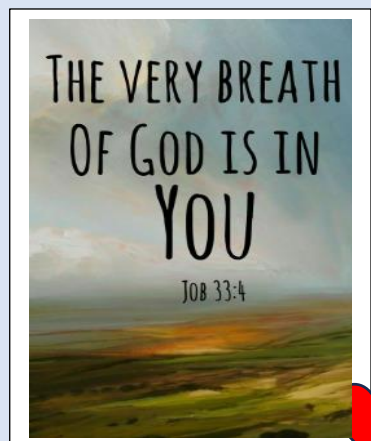
Dear all,

'Peep into Glazebury's History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8<sup>th</sup> 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1900- Mar 23-John Parr, Monitor left school to go to work at the Albion Foundry Leigh.

1900 Apr 2-Edward Wood engaged as monitor in place of John Parr. He is 14 ½ years old – born 1885.

1900-Apr 6<sup>th</sup>- commenced a lending library for children – 11 books lent out.

1900-Mar 12- Prizes to 72 were given out for regular attendance during the year.





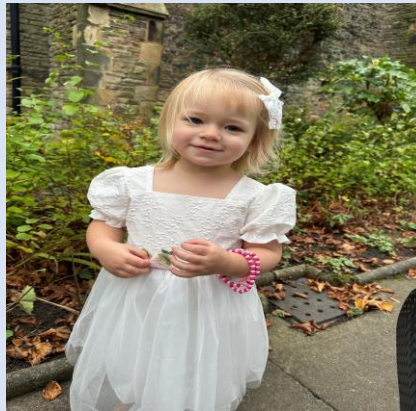




# Celebrating YOU!
