NSPCC- PANTS safeguarding information for parents

As you may be aware the NSPCC are a national charity that specialise in child protection and are dedicated to protecting children today to prevent abuse tomorrow. The approved safeguarding resources are used by schools to help bring important messages to children at an age-appropriate level.

Next week children in Reception to Year 6 will be discussing the NSPCC's PANTS resources and remembering the rules from our PSHE lessons in class. During these discussions we will aim to teach our children the following important safety skills without giving explicit information or telling scary stories. We will be teaching our pupils how to stay safe by learning the PANTS mnemonic, which the NSPCC have developed to be like a Green Cross Code for staying safe from sexual abuse.

PANTS stands for:

- Privates are private.
- Always remember your body belongs to you.
- No means no.
- Talk about secrets that upset you.
- Speak up, someone can help.

The lessons will introduce a range of ideas, all delivered in a way that's fully age-appropriate, empowering pupils without using any frightening words. These include:

- good and bad touching
- your child's right to say no to things that make them feel upset or uncomfortable
- naming parts of the body
- who your child can turn to if they ever feel upset or worried.
