

'Peep into Glazebury's History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school logbooks that date back to July 8<sup>th</sup> 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

**1904-** April **11**<sup>th</sup> – Reopened school, the school is running short of exercise books through Master not knowing where to order goods. County Education Committee's regulations have not yet been received. Slates have to be used.

May 11<sup>th</sup> – Two fresh cases of measles – 60 children are absent now regularly.

May  $13^{th}$  – Dr Challoner Medical Officer visited the school and ordered the closing of the same until May 30th




