Head Teacher's Hello



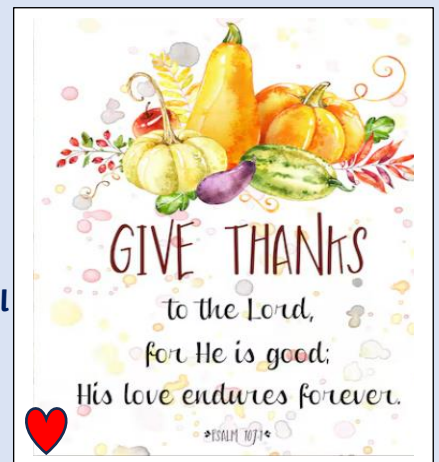
Dear all,

### How can we celebrate our Black History?

Satyrab, or Ty as she prefers to be called, is a Senior Crime Scene Investigator with West Yorkshire Police.

**My job is to visit crime scenes and collect forensic evidence. That could be saliva, fingerprints, blood or footprints. We are trained in observations and to make sure the physical evidence is captured and stored correctly.**

The theme for this year's Black History Month is 'reclaiming narratives', which is all about honouring our Black heroes, and shining a light on the contributions and achievements of Black individuals both in the UK and globally. Who is your hero?

I've got two. The first is Viola Davis. She's an American actress and the first Black female to win an Emmy as a lead actress in a drama series. I feel like Viola really uses her fame and platform to highlight racial disparity. She knows her own power and isn't afraid to use it.

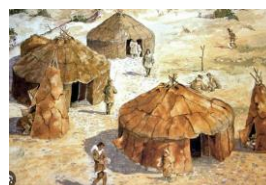

'Peep into Glazebury's History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8<sup>th</sup> 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1899 9<sup>th</sup> Oct – Found it necessary to remove several children from the singing lessons- they were not being musical.

1899 7<sup>th</sup> Dec- Closed school on account of darkness- gas failing.

1900-Jan 23-Owing to the wet stormy weather playtime was abandoned, school was closed at 10 minutes to four.

1900 Feb 15<sup>th</sup>- No school in afternoon on account of storm-children very wet.

**App Features**

- Man Down:** when enabled, this feature detects if you've had a sudden fall or stopped moving for a period of time.
- Duress Pin:** If you are forced to deactivate on alert, you can use the 999 duress pin to escalate the alert.
- Journey Feature:** This allows you to track a journey, ensuring you are safe wherever you travel.
- Meeting Feature:** This feature is useful for meeting new people, allowing you to set an alert timer.
- Reports:** Allows you to record an incident with photo evidence which is instantly time-stamped & geo-tagged.
- Check In:** Allows users to send a quick, instant geo-stamped notification to their nominated emergency contacts.
