

'Peep into Glazebury's History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1899 9th Oct – Found it necessary to remove several children from the singing lessons- they were not being musical.

1899 7th Dec-Closed school on account of darkness- gas failing.

1900-Jan 23-Owing to the wet stormy weather playtime was abandoned, school was closed at 10 minutes to four.

1900 Feb 15th- No school in afternoon on account of storm-children very wet.

School Meal Prices - Warrington Borough Council school meal price is set to increase from £2.60 to £2.80 from Monday 4th November when school returns after the October half term holiday, resulting in an overall weekly increase of £1 per child. The three weekly rolling menus detailing each day's main course and dessert, with the additional daily offer of a vegetarian option and/or jacket potato, will remain in place. 
Themed Cinema Night Reception to Year 6 children are


