Head Teacher's Hello



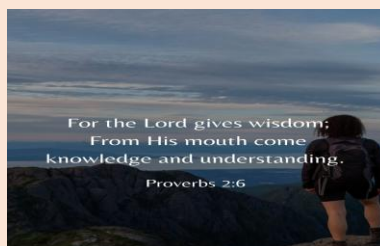

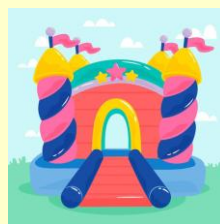
20.12.2021 – The Vicar visited today and checked the registers.

Library Summer Reading Challenge

The Library Summer Reading Challenge is a national initiative that is organised by the Reading Agency to encourage children to keep reading over the summer holidays. The challenge is to read 6 six books between 4th July and 14th September. To take part, the children sign up for free at the library and receive a booklet that helps track their reading. Once they have read 3 books they go back to the library and collect a set of stickers and reward and then borrow 3 more library books. When the next 3 books have been read, then the children go back to the library to collect their final reward and medal.

IMPORTANT NEW INFORMATION OF CHANGES Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

Warrington Borough Council have advised of important changes to **Free School Meals (FSM)** and **Pupil Premium (PP)** from **September 2026**. Below gives you a simple overview of what is changing and what you need to do.

What is changing:

For 2026/27 academic year, all children attending a maintained school, academy or free school will qualify for FSM if their family receives Universal Credit.

New FSM categories:

There will now be two types of FSM:

Targeted FSM

For pupils whose families receive Universal Credit and earn £7,400 or less per year

Expanded FSM

For pupils whose families receive Universal Credit and earn above £7,400 per year

Important: Only pupils eligible for Targeted FSM will receive PP funding from September 2026

Please apply without delay to check your eligibility

In the first instance you can visit www.warrington.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals and download / complete the application form.

Free School Meals

Important Update
From September 2026
National eligibility criteria for Free School Meals (FSM) is expanding.

New rules
All households receiving Universal Credit will now qualify.
Current £7,400 income threshold removed.

How This Helps You
Families could save up to **£495 per child**, per year on school meal costs*.

What You Need To Do
If you receive Universal Credit, you should **apply for Free School Meals before 30 September 2026**.
