

'Peep into Glazebury's History from Log Books -We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.



Nov 4th 1878: Katherine Hindley was kept away from school on account of fever being in the home.

Jan 7th 1879: Received three new desks.

June 28th: Haymaking commences and many children working in fields.

August 15th 1879: a number of children are away from school during this week as they are working in the hay.

Aug 19th 1879: Rev. G Feather visited school and heard children sing.

Reception – All our reception children have received a golden ticket this week for wonderful behaviour at the zoo. Well done reception.


