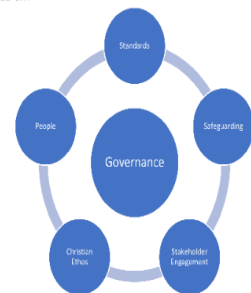

**'Peep into Glazebury' s History from Log Books -We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8<sup>th</sup> 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.**



Nov 4<sup>th</sup> 1878: Katherine Hindley was kept away from school on account of fever being in the home.

Jan 7<sup>th</sup> 1879: Received three new desks.

June 28<sup>th</sup> : Haymaking commences and many children working in fields.

August 15<sup>th</sup> 1879: a number of children are away from school during this week as they are working in the hay.

Aug 19<sup>th</sup> 1879: Rev. G Feather visited school and heard children sing.

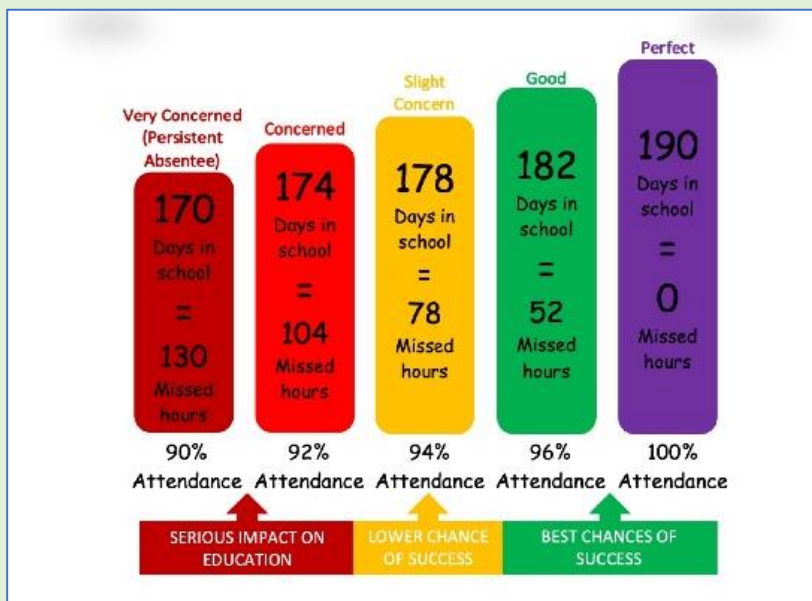
