'Peep into Glazebury's History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1900-Sept 13th-Had occasion to lecture the children on the mischievous habit of knocking fruit off trees with stones and stealing same.

1900-Oct 9th-Election Day Holiday

1900 Jan 7th- received notice of special aid grant for maintenance improvement of staff £20, increased salaries, Head Teacher £4, Assistant £6, better instruction of P.T's £12 total £42.

Healthy Lunch Boxes

Please note that to promote a health and balanced pack lunch, we would like to provide information based on recent research.

For lunch boxes to aid children's growth and health they should consist of:

- Fruit and vegetables
- Unrefined starchy foods – for example, multigrain bread, pasta or rice.
- Sources of protein – meat, fish, eggs beans etc.
- Milk or other dairy produces – ie cheese.
- A small amount of fat, sugar and salt.
- Water, milk or juice.

Please remember we are a nut free school, we have children in school with severe nut allergies, therefore please ensure your child's snack and pack lunch do not contain any nuts and check ingredients if you are not sure.

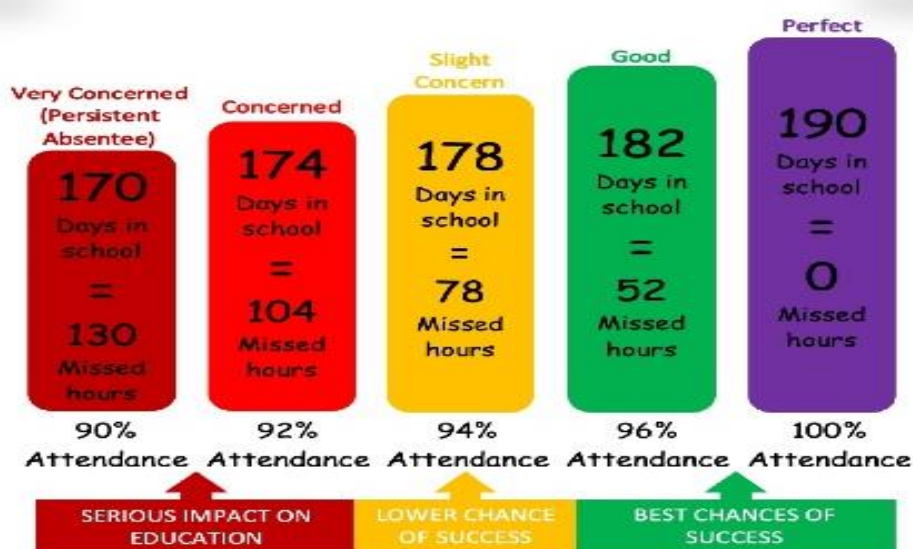


ATTENDANCE
