



'Peep into Glazebury's History from Log Books - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

28th Sept 1894 - Resigned my position as Head Teacher of this school after having charge of it 16 years (Sep1878-Sep1894) **James Eastwood**

1st Oct 1894-J.K.W. Brade took charge of this school.

3rd Oct 1894- Songs-Do the Best You Can, Birds in Summertime, Welcome Little Robin, Far Away.

11th April 1895 - Poetry for this year:

Somebody's Mother, Sunshine and Showers...Mixed Dept 143 children.








Clubs welcome pupils in Year 3—Year 6. The cost of each club is £3.50 per week. Payment is via ParentPay




ATTENDANCE
