'Peep into Glazebury History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school logbooks that date back to July  $8^{\rm th}$  1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1909-May 11<sup>th</sup> – two boys named Peter and Bertie Bennett came to school in a filthy state were found to have no undervests on and old dirty rags for shirts. Teachers washed them and got a fresh shirt for each.

1909-August 9<sup>th</sup> - A number of children in the Leigh boundary attend school very irregularly. The officer in this district does not visit often enough.

A winner will be chosen for the most amazing creation and the winner will receive a Christmas prize.




