

This week we have had a visit from Mrs Swinson our LDST Chair of Directors, she came to share her knowledge of Harold Moody, who was a member of her family. Harold Moody was born in Kingston Jamaica. He came to London from Jamaica in 1904 to study medicine at King's College, London. It is said that Harold set up his own GP practice, as a result of him being denied a hospital appointment out of racial prejudice. He became a well-respected and sought-after GP. He was an activist, and Harold's campaigning work bought him to lobby the civil service, trade unions and parliament



to help improve race relations. Harold Moody has clearly laid the ground for racial equality. In 1995 the English Heritage put a blue plaque outside where Harold lived, in recognition of his campaign for racial equality. He was a doctor, activist and leader. **We are proud of you.**

We are really looking forward to the Grand Final on Thursday 20th July at 1pm. Important School Meal Notice - Please be advised that the cost of a school meal is set to rise from £2.40 to £2.60 from September 2023, resulting in an overall weekly increase of £1 per child.

This is the first price increase in school meals since 2019 as the council has prioritised supporting families in these times of hardship. Where possible, the council will continue to subsidise services where it can and are looking at support for those families that are struggling but are not eligible for free school meals. Further information on this will be shared in the new academic year.

The three weekly rolling menu detailing each day's main course and dessert, with the additional daily offer of a vegetarian option and jacket potato will remain in place. The school meals service will continue to provide a high-quality service that delivers healthy, nutritious meals, caters for all allergens and dietary requirements, and is served in a safe environment on our school premises. We will continue to offer theme days, treat lunches and inviting families to join children for special lunches through the year.
