May I take this opportunity on behalf of all in our Glazebury family to wish you all a happy Christmas and a wonderful new year to come. Mrs Mowbray







'Peep into Glazebury's History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school log books that date back to July 8^{th} 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1901- Feb 12th- attendance is high this week – lots to celebrate

1901 -Mar 15th – had to close school early today – heating not sufficient

1901- Apr 2nd – Diocesan inspectors in school today for our school report – hope all goes well for both the teachers and children.


