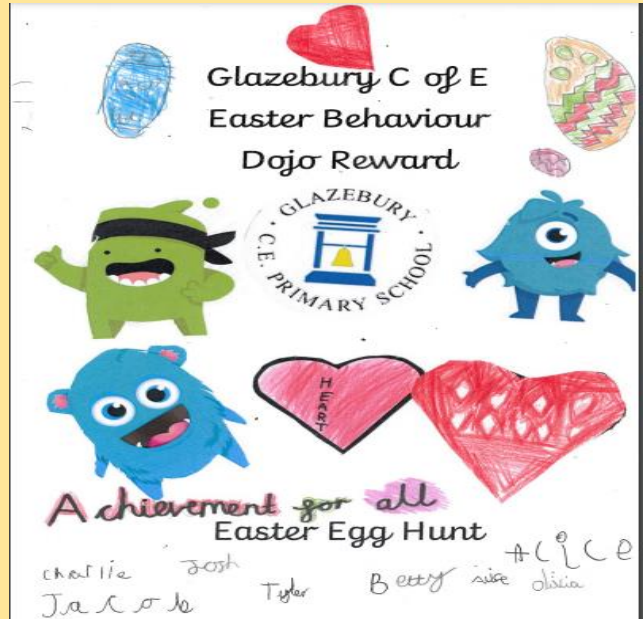
Thank you Farmer Berties Ltd

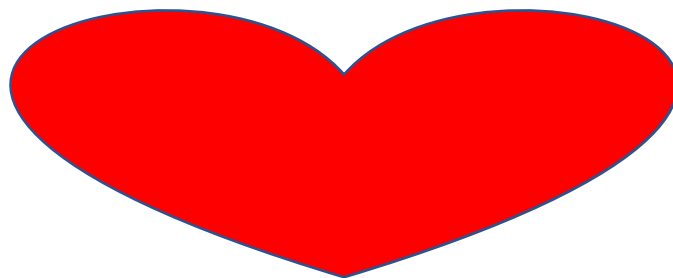
