




1900- 17th April – Punished Thomas Croston and Albert Sumner for throwing stones and wounding an old man – Lectured the whole school about it.

Punished Bert Wright and William Holden for quarrelling and fighting in the playground. Gave them 2 strokes each with cane across the hands.


Each child will be given a clear bauble, tag and ribbon so they can decorate by painting, glueing, glittering and filling. Each bauble will be the same but different.


Decorate your bauble at home, add the label using the string provided with your child's, first name and class.
