As a result of unparalleled disruption to children's education during the Coronavirus pandemic since March 2020, it has been determined that the most vulnerable and disadvantaged children were among the hardest hit. To aid the national recovery of learning, the government has produced a one-off universal 'Catch-up Premium' for 2020-2021, this has been coupled with a National Tutoring Programme to provide additional and targeted support for those that need it most.

Funding is given in 3 tranches through the year and schools have the flexibility to spend these monies in the best way for their cohort and circumstances.

This document will be updated and reviewed regularly within the year.
