'Peep into Glazebury History from Logbooks - We are in possession of our school logbooks that date back to July 8th 1873, before we were even in our school building in 1882. We thought we would share some of the accounts with you each week.

1903-April 9th -School closed until Monday April 20th on account of Easter and building operations in the school.

1903-April 20th - Reopened school and admitted 10 new children owing to building operations, most of the oral lessons will be suspended for a few weeks.

1903-April 24th- Had occasion to warn children about climbing on and over school walls.

1903-May 7th -Punished Harold Whittle severely for playing truant and telling lies.
